
20th ANNUAL HOLIDAY TOUR "THE HISTORY OF GHRISTMAS"



Darius Minier, Civil War soldier, Reminisces about the War



Darius Minier

As the 150th anniversary of the end of the Civil war approaches, (1865-2015) this program will provide a "close-up" view of one Civil War soldier. Darius Minier was one of 7 Ohio Brothers that fought in the Civil War. Darius was wounded twice, a prisoner of war twice, and survived the sinking of the side-wheeler *Sultana* as it was returning Union prisoners home after the war. This Program will be a First Person portrayal of Darius Minier, a Civil War veteran, talking about his war experiences with local boys from his Denver neighborhood. The setting is in Denver, Colorado in September 1905, just after the GAR (Grand Army of the Republic parade for the 39th National Convention.

Darius will be portrayed by Benny Nasser. Benny Nasser is a graduate of the University of Colorado with a BS in Chemistry. He also has an MBA from OSU. In his search for his roots, Benny found a great number of his ancestors fought in the Civil War. Benny is a member of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War and the 21st Michigan Volunteer Infantry as well as the 2nd Colorado Volunteer Infantry, Civil War re-enacting units.

The program will be on Friday, January 9, 2014 at the Old Colorado City History Center, 1 South 24th Street, Colorado Springs, Colorado 80904. The presentation begins at 11:00 a.m. The doors open at 10:30 a.m. Members of OCCHS attend free, non-members pay \$5. Light refreshments will be served.

Treasurer's Report November, 2014

As year-end approaches I wanted to look at the overall finances of this year's operations for the Society. As you know, we can only use the Endowment Account Interest for an emergency but the reality is we do not use it, as our goal is to grow an endowment large enough that one day the interest will cover our annual operations. We are at about one fifth of our goal for the Endowment.

When Endowment is met, one day in the far future, the members of our society can spend more of their time and efforts on our Mission, preserving history and education, and less of our time working fundraisers to keep the lights on. The Endowment Account grows from generous bequests from our members.

But as that is a Dream for the Future, each year we must make money to cover our general operating expenses.

Our Operating Budget this year was \$19,000 and as of this date we have taken in \$16,963. Our Expenses Budget this year was \$19,000 and this year we have spent a little over our budget so far. Our last big push to end the year with Operations in the "plus" side of things is our Holiday Tour along with any year end donations to the Society.

Why have we spent over our budget? Well, we have cut back expenses in every area of the society AND we have had success in all of our fundraising efforts but, we did spend extra this year in building repairs. It is our hope that we will receive donations that, by the end of the year, will make up the difference.

Our historic building is OCCHS's biggest asset and we have a responsibility to take care of it. We will be working hard in the next year to look into Grants available to preserve and improve our building
